Who can tell me what is going to be happening in about a week that is so very exciting?	Take answers, looking for “Easter”
I'll give you a clue (if needed) ...	Open the box of Eggs
It's Easter. I <u>love</u> Easter, in fact it's my favourite day of the year. Everyone loves Easter. Here's one of the big reasons why.	Take out a Kinder surprise egg (they're heavier, rattle and have neater foil wrapping) and unwrap it slowly.
Easter is an exciting time with foil wrapped eggs, And when you open the foil, look what's there- chocolate! But that's not the end. The best bit about Easter eggs is when inside there is something else. What's inside this one? A surprise!	Reveal the Kinder surprise- a plastic toy!
But there is more to Easter than that.	Hold up one of the blown eggs wrapped in foil.
Do you know why we give eggs at Easter?	Unwrap to reveal a real egg.
